IN THE COURT OF PUBLIC OPINION

DISENFRANCHISED PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF VIRGINIA V GOVERNOR NORTHAM

RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF WRIT OF PROHIBITION

PETITIONERS, THE DISENFRANCHISED PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF VIRGINIA respectfully petition this Court of Public Opinion for a Writ of Prohibition restraining the Honorable Ralph Northam, Governor of the State of Virginia, from enforcing or attempting to enforce any Executive Order that continues to impose a quarantine that in any way infringes upon the peoples' 1st Amendment rights of Free Exercise, Free Speech, Free Assembly, or that in any way infringes upon their unalienable rights to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness, including their ability to work and otherwise carryon the normal activities attendant to their ability to live life.

BASIS FOR INVOKING JURISDICTION This is an original action afforded Petitioners as citizens and confirmed as unalienable rights under the Bill of Rights, Declaration, and the Laws of Nature and Nature's God.

Whereas, Governor Northam has enacted Executive Orders that are capricious, expansive, and violate the rights of the Petitioners;

Whereas, such Executive Orders prevent the Petitioners from enjoying their rights of free exercise, free speech, free assembly, and generally deny the rights of Petitioners to earn a livelihood and otherwise carryon the normal activities attendant to living life:

Whereas, such quarantine is subjectively excessive in time, scope, and activities such that it bears no significant relation to any compelling state interest and further fails to be narrowly tailored;

Whereas, such quarantine as applied to various groups of people is onerous and subjectively limits certain activities evidencing viewpoint discrimination;

Therefore, be it

Resolved, that Governor Northam will as of May 15th cease and desist from enforcing or in any way executing these quarantines that have been established through his Executive Orders;

Resolved, that Governor Northam is formally prohibited from further encroaching on the rights and liberties of his constituents after the date of May 15th; and

Resolved, that should Governor Northam choose to ignore this public will of his constituents, that said constituents give full notice of their intent to engage in organized civil disobedience en masse against any such tyrannical exercise of power beyond the proper authority afforded the position of Governor; and

Resolved, that should Governor Northam choose to sanction those constituents who act in accordance with such civil disobedience, that every remedy afforded said constituents at law and politically will be pursued by the parties deprived of their liberty.
